

<u>REMINDER</u>: Due to Governor Polis' Executive Order, the MA campus is closed and ALL previously scheduled events are cancelled from March 16th - April 17th.

School through Distance Learning will resume after Spring Break on March 30th.

In accordance with the Executive Order from Governor Polis closing all Colorado public and private schools from March 16th through April 17th, Monument Academy joins El Paso County and School District 38 in a school campus closure with school resuming on March 30th through Distance Learning (please refer to information included below). This campus closure is an effort to keep our Monument Academy and greater community safe and healthy. All extracurricular clubs and sports, field trips, and out-of-school activities have been cancelled during this time.

This means that both teachers and students will remain off campus and out of the building during this March 16^{th} – April 17^{th} mandatory school campus closure. Everyone is currently scheduled to return to Monument Academy on April 20^{th} . Please ensure that you are monitoring your emails from the school and district in order to be up-to-date with the latest information as well as detailed instruction for online learning and communications from the administration and your children's teachers.

Dear Monument Academy Community,

Our priority continues to be the health and safety of our students, families, staff members, and our greater community. With our closure, we are taking proactive steps to prevent the spread of the virus. We will continue to assess with the district the April 17th return date, and are deploying a number of instructional continuity protocols for implementation (including device and Internet availability for staff and students, as well as the creation of video lessons and lesson plans for online learning) and we are ready to execute beginning March 30th. The team has also compiled pages for educational resources and activities for parents that have been posted on the MA website, please also click on the Facebook link from the MA website for highlighted activities and "family favorites".

The Administrative Team has been brainstorming ways that we as a school community can facilitate a platform for the communication of needs. We are creating an email sign up for people willing to receive communications and a form for people who wish to communicate a need. The idea is to resemble an old-time town hall forum to take care of our community members without the face-to-face group meetings. So, as an example, my husband and I keep baby items for when the grandbaby visits. If there was a mom out there in short supply of formula, we could drop it on her porch...We have a community with generous hearts who wish to care for one another but the necessary isolation and limiting person-to-person contact make this difficult. It is our hope that this platform will be one venue for helping to facilitate the support of one another. An email communication will be sent at the start of next week with sign up links if you would like to participate. Please note that this is a voluntary participation.

Thank you for your partnership with MA. Thank you to our MA Board of Directors; their first and primary concern is for our families and faculty and ensuring everyone is cared for. Thank you to our MA community for your positivity, encouragement, and humor in the face of this challenge. Parents and care givers, please also take care of yourselves, not just with hand washing, but also by getting rest, taking vitamins, and finding ways not to stress, so that we continue to be best able to care for our loved ones. I greatly value each of you.

A Note About Distance Learning

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We are pleased to be able to offer e-learning for our students starting March 30th. Our teachers have been working hard to create digital lessons and instructional videos so their students can see their faces and hear their voices, and words of reassurance for when they get to "see" each other again on Monday, March 30th. We know that our families are navigating many challenges right now. With that in mind, it is our desire to streamline and simplify our remote learning process. We will also rely on our families to communicate what is working well and where we can improve.

We are using *Canvas* to organize lessons during this school closure. Middle school students will still see their classes and assignments as they have all year. Their teachers will include video instruction in place of classroom instruction. Elementary students will be able to find their e-learning lessons and assignments on the grade-level web pages listed on the Monument Academy website. In addition to assignments and instructional videos, your teachers will offer additional activity links. All of our teachers, both in elementary and middle school, will post contact information and office hours, as well as class codes and *Calendly* appointment schedulers that you may need. More specific details are forthcoming. Rest assured that we are keeping the challenges of remote learning in mind and are working the details to provide access, support, and ease of use.

Here are some tips to assist you and your student as we embark on this journey together!

- Create a schedule with your student(s) Having a schedule provides structure for a new situation. Here is a
 link to a schedule that is editable for your family: <u>Sample Schedule</u>. If you like it, go to file and "make a copy"
 to edit.
- Flexibility within structure is a positive. These are new experiences, and students may need to change things up based on emotions.
- Create a workspace Students find it easier to remain focused and get the most out of their lessons without the distraction of toys, television, and cell phones.
- Being your child's learning guide can bring about its own challenges. Be prepared for frustration, and ready
 with a kind word and a smile. Take a break. Reach out to your child's teachers during office hours to discuss
 questions. Have your child reach out to his/her teacher. We're also flexible!

Office hours for the tech department - Mrs. Weber and Ms. Ross cannot diagnose Internet connection problems for your home, but they can guide you in clicking what you need to click, finding what you need to find, and logging in with usernames and passwords that may have been forgotten over our long break. They are happy to help with tech issues!


