

Aaron Meschuk

Family: Born - March 21, 1974. College - Citrus College (CA), Chapman University (CA), Bachelor of Arts Degree in United States History (1998), Concordia University - Irvine (CA) Master of Arts in Coaching and Athletic Administration (2010). Coach Meschuk and his wife Jodie have been married for thirteen years, and have a 11 year old son, Lincoln, a 9 year old son, Marshall, and a 6 year old daughter, Adeline. Coach Meschuk's wife Jodie, was multiple sport athlete (basketball and track) in college. She was a two-time NCCAA All-American (Cedarville University) in track and finished her collegiate basketball career at California State University - Fullerton. Coach Meschuk and his family recently moved to Colorado in June, 2018.

Playing career: Coach Meschuk was a four year varsity lettermen and played for CIF-SS Hall of Fame Coach, Tom Caffrey and future CHSAA Hall of Fame Coach, Phil Bravo (Monarch HS) at Whittier Christian High School in La Habra, California. He was a member of three Olympic League Championships and one CIF-SS/1A State Championship team. Coach Meschuk was named All-League for three consecutive years and All-CIF two consecutive years. He was awarded the Olympic League MVP & Coca-Cola Prep Player of the Year and played in the 605 All-Star Game. Coach Meschuk led Orange County (CA) in rushing with 2,200 yards his senior year and was named to the All-Decade Team of the 1990s by Whittier Daily New. Coach Meschuk played college football at Citrus College (CA) where he was received 2nd Team All-Conference honors and played in the Southern California Bowl. He transferred to Chapman University (CA) where he was the starting Fullback on the inaugural football team. Coach Meschuk's head coach, coached under the legendary NFL coach, George Allen at Long Beach State while his offensive coordinator was an assistant coach on the 1990 National Championship team at Colorado University.

Coaching career: Coach Meschuk has twenty-one years of college and high school coaching experience in California, Illinois and Texas. As a head coach, he coached over seventy All-Conference or All-League athletes, five *Player of the Year* selections and named *Coach of the Year* in 2011 and 2014. In addition to winning a championship (2000) and three runner-ups, Coach Meschuk has had 10 student-athletes play college football at the NCAA Division 1 & III and NAIA level. He served for five years as a "Visiting Coach" for the University of Notre Dame Summer Football Camp as well as other college and professional football camps. Coach Meschuk has experience and dedication to building consistent successful football programs focusing on the importance of fundamentals, techniques and strategies which allows an athlete to perform at a high level.
