Middle School Info from Principal Seymour:

Many things take place at this time of year, and we are working out the details of those procedures. We are also dedicated to celebrating our students at the end of their academic year! We will share details as they are finalized; however, here are the things we are working on:

End of year celebrations: We are planning for an awards ceremony video that celebrates student's accomplishments. We are also working on details of an 8th-grade graduation ceremony that will still take place on May 19th while following Governor Polis' *Safer at Home* guidelines.

In this time of unpredictability, we have had to adapt in so many ways. Already we are seeing the restructuring of priorities. We are finding things that were simply not necessarily.


So, the question is: What changes do you want to keep when all this is over?
