- Canvas Gradebooks in each course list current assignments and in-progress grades. See the access options above.
- Infinite Campus Reports provide printable end of quarter and semester Grade Cards. You
 may access the IC Parent Portal
 at https://campus.lewispalmer.org/campus/portal/lewispalmer.jsp.
- Email or call teachers when you have a question about what you see in Canvas.

Do's and Don'ts

Please respect our carline start-time by <u>not</u> **dropping off students** <u>before</u> <u>7:30 am</u>. There is no supervision of students prior to 7:30am.</u>

Anyone wishing to reach the parking lot during afternoon carline should either arrive early (before 3:10 PM) or approach the building from the dirt road to the southeast (Pinehurst Circle) that was used earlier in the year. From the dirt road you should be able to carefully pull around any traffic that might be waiting to enter the parking area. It will be very difficult to reach the parking lot quickly during afternoon carline after about 3:10 to 3:15 PM entering the facility from the Walker Road entrance.

When leaving Monument Academy's East Campus, if you need to exit to the southeast on Pinehurst Circle, please exit our parking lot by turning right, use the roundabout to the west turn around and head back southeast on Pinehurst Circle to go through the neighborhood to our South and, if desired, access Hodgen Rd.

D38 will offer free meals to ALL students beginning Monday, September 21st, regardless of eligibility. The USDA is financing these free meals with Congressionally appropriated funding. The USDA anticipates this funding will last through December.

While it's available, D38 will also offer free meals for online learners (children under 18 years old). Meals will be distributed between 11:15 – 11:45 a.m. (or until they run out of meals), Monday – Friday, at Lewis-Palmer High School. Important Notice from the School Nurse

If your child is sick with any **MAJOR** symptom such as:

- Feeling feverish, having chills
- Temperature of 100.4 or greater
- Loss of taste or smell
- New or unexplained persistent cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing

THEY MAY NOT ATTEND SCHOOL. If the above symptoms completely resolve within 24 hours with *no medication,* they may return to school.

*Students who had a fever must remain fever free for an additional 24 hours with no medication prior to return.

If your child is sick with any $\ensuremath{\textbf{MINOR}}$ symptom such as

- Sore throat
- Runny nose or congestion
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- Fatigue
- Nausea or Vomiting
- Diarrhea

THEY MAY NOT ATTEND SCHOOL. If the above minor symptoms completely resolve within 48 hours with *no medication*, they may return to school.

*If a student has **both** major and minor symptoms, they must be well within 24 hours to return to school.

If any symptom continues beyond the 24-48 hour window, the student must remain home for 10 days from date of initial symptom onset.

• A negative COVID test will not allow a student to return sooner (there is a chance of false negative results)

• A letter from a medical provider with an alternative diagnosis *might* allow a sooner return, depending on the diagnosis and laboratory confirmation. Please contact your school nurse to determine when your child is eligible to return.

Siblings that are symptom-free may continue to attend school.

Anyone with a known exposure to someone with COVID-19 should quarantine for 14 days after the exposure, regardless of illness.

Some individuals with COVID-19 will have minor symptoms that can mimic the common cold. These guidelines were recommended by the El Paso Health Department and are designed to be cautious due to the fact that community transmission of COVID-19 remains medium-high in our community. We appreciate your assistance in keeping our schools open.
