Tomorrow - Thursday, September 10th will be Free Dress for secondary students.

At-Home Learners:

Every other Wednesday and Thursday is a block day, so that means you will be tuning into your classes according to a different schedule on these days. If you follow the at-home learners schedule, look for your teacher/course and see whether they offer the live Zoom on a Wednesday or Thursday. Today was EXTRA special because it was a delayed start Block Day! Kudos to you if you were able to navigate all three schedules without incident!

Let's add NWEA to that as well! We recognize that many of you had difficulty today with completing the NWEA assessments. We will be in communication soon to let you know how we will reschedule.

You may have noticed that you have some classes on your Block schedule that only happen on Block Days. These classes are called "Reading", "Peak", and "Success Time" or "Leadership.

Free Reading happens every Block Day Wednesday and Thursday after the first period (Wednesdays) and second period (Thursdays). We won't be zooming anything live during this time as it is truly a free reading time. Find a book and read it for at least 30 minutes on these Wednesdays and Thursdays.

Peak time is the new name for our House System. The name isn't the only thing that has changed, though! You will tune into your assigned Peak tomorrow from 11:25-12:40 for a lunch game (during 11:25-11:55) and then continue on for the first Peak meeting from 12:00-12:45 to find out more about the changes. Links will be posted in the Live Zoom links sheet. Please check your Infinite Campus before tomorrow to make sure you know which teacher's Zoom link you will be looking for, as there have been several changes today. Plan to eat lunch at 11:25 tomorrow with your fellow students so you can play the lunch game. You will add to your Peak's total points based on the items you have in your lunch!

The NWEA Success time will not start tomorrow, and I'll give you more info about that for next week. When your Peak Meeting ends tomorrow, you're done with Success Time!

Freshman, you have a unique class that only Freshman take on Thursdays after Peak Time. Look for that Zoom link tomorrow after your Peak Time. Mr. Herndon is our Freshman Leadership teacher and he's looking forward to meeting you!

IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE

Dear Monument Academy Parents:

The purpose of this information is to <u>highlight the health services</u> provided to all families attending Monument Academy.

Illness/Exclusion Information:

MA is committed to keeping students healthy and safe. To meet this goal, MA follows guidance from local and state health departments. For illness information and exclusion criteria, we use evidence-based infectious disease guidelines from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Education. *Please note that because of the COVID-19 pandemic, we DO and WILL anticipate excluding students for symptoms we can typically manage at school, including increased temperature without

other symptoms, sudden onset cough, sore throat, headache and diarrhea (among some others). Once we are at a different stage in the management of the pandemic, we will be happy to revert to the CDPHE Infectious Disease Guidelines without an extra consideration for COVID-19.

Medication and/or Nursing Procedures at School:

Some students may require medication (over-the-counter, prescription) or nursing procedures during the school day. If your student requires either medication or a nursing procedure, a current signed order by your student's health care provider is required. Specifics Related to Medications and Nursing Procedures at School:

Monument Academy follows Lewis Palmer D-38 Medication administration policy <u>https://go.boarddocs.com/co/lewispalmer/Board.nsf/vpublic#</u>

*In order to give prescription medications at school, the school nurse will need written medication orders from the student's licensed health care provider with prescribing authority and the parent/guardian authorizes that the school nurse can confirm these medication orders with the provider.

*Medication should be in the original container with a pharmacy label that includes the student's name, prescribing provider's name, name of drug, dose, route, time and/or frequency. This label must match the order form.

*Medication will be administered by the school nurse or by delegated and trained school personnel. Albuterol & Epinephrine will be kept in the clinic unless written permission for a student to carry these medications is given by the parent/guardian, provider, and school nurse. This requires that the student demonstrate the necessary maturity to keep it on their person, and that it can be secured safely at all times. In order to give over the counter (OTC) medications at school....If the student needs <u>OTC medications on a regular basis</u>, the school nurse will need written medication orders from the student's licensed health care provider with prescribing authority and the parent/guardian authorizes that the school nurse can confirm these medication orders with the provider.

In addition, the OTC medication must be provided to the school in the original container with the manufacturer label. This is for emergent or occasional use. **This is a change from years past.**

In order to give homeopathic/supplement interventions at school, the school nurse will need written orders from the student's licensed health care provider with prescribing authority and the parent/guardian authorizes that the school nurse can confirm these orders with the provider.

Immunization Record: Colorado law requires all students attending Colorado schools and licensed childcare to be vaccinated against certain diseases, unless an exemption is filed (Board of Health rule 6 CCR 1009-2). <u>https://www.monumentacademy.net/wp-content/uploads/2017/12/Non-Medical-Exemption-English-2017-18.pdf</u>

Health Conditions: Many of our students have health conditions including asthma, allergies to foods or medications, diabetes, epilepsy/seizure disorders, or other chronic illnesses. When we know about these conditions, we can better help keep students safe and healthy while at school. If YOUR student has any health issues, it is very important to note them during online registration and alert your student's school nurse by email, phone or in-person.

Vision & Hearing Screenings: District 38 has a team to complete vision and hearing screenings annually. MA follows the Colorado Department of Education screening guidelines for grade level

specific screenings. *Please note: during the COVID-19 pandemic, vision and hearing screenings will vary to comply with safety and distancing. Contact your school nurse with any questions.

ASSESSMENTS

Your 3rd – 9th grade students are completing NWEA assessments in the following subject areas:

Reading Language Usage Math Science (5th - 9th)

NWEA is given at Monument Academy in the fall and spring to measure both student achievement and growth. NWEA is not a "high stakes" standardized assessment, it is a set of adaptive assessments delivered on computers/iPads, meaning the questions asked (and assessment results) are determined by the difficulty of the questions that the student CAN answer correctly. These assessments are very rigorous for any student that gives their best effort with most students correctly answering only about 50% of the questions they are asked.

So long as students give their best effort, assessment results will show what students know and what they are ready to learn regardless of their current grade level. Monument Academy receives results the next day and uses these results to help inform instruction. Students will see their raw scores immediately upon completion of the assessments, but a Student Progress Report will not be uploaded to IC for the parents to view until after the district assessment window closes, typically in late September or early October. Instructions for viewing NWEA results will be included in the Lynx News and sent via the school messenger to all families.

Please help us reinforce to your student the importance of always giving their best effort, in this case so that we may obtain accurate results that will help us to best support them in the classroom.
