Dear East Campus Families,

I hope you had a fabulous Thanksgiving Break! We are back in session this week via remote learning and back in-person on December 7. We look forward to seeing everyone's face again soon!

Every year in December, the School Accountability Advisory Committee distributes a parent survey as a mid-year marker for how the school is doing in academics, connections, communication, atmosphere, and overall mission and vision. We use the data to identify areas of strength and areas for growth. The survey helps the Principals and Chief Operating Officer focus on continuous improvement at Monument Academy toward the most worthy goal of educating your precious children.

Last year's survey results are posted on our website under the SAAC committee tab on the Board's page. The results of the current survey will be posted there in January.

We need your help! To use the data, we need to know that it represents the majority of our families. The more families that complete the survey, the more useful the information will be! We have shortened the survey considerably. There are only nine questions, and it should take about four minutes to complete. If you have a middle school student and a high school student, you will fill out a separate survey for each school. If you have more than one student in middle school or high school, you will only fill out that survey one time.

Last year we only had a 25% participation rate, which made the information we received less actionable. We have set a goal of at least 50% participation this year and would love it if we could get even higher!

The middle school students will earn a **pajama day** if at least 125 families complete the survey. The high school students will earn a **pajama day** if at least 12 families complete the survey.

Free meals will also be distributed beginning Tuesday, December 1, at Lewis-Palmer Middle School between 11:30 - noon (or until we run out of meals) at the front of the building. Follow normal traffic routes.

All designs must adhere to the following requirements:

- Submitted designs must be original illustrations and include artist's signature and 2020.
- Design MUST be in Black Ink. Pencil drawings do not scan well. Please consider simple, bold designs instead of those with many lines and shadows.
- Submissions must contain all 40 book titles. https://ppbattleofthebooks.weebly.com/book-list.html

Artists can use the book titles directly in their design or listed underneath the design.

- Design must include something to recognize the unique year with the Virtual Battle. (the April and May competitions will be virtual and not in person.)
- Design must be submitted in a digital format in Adobe Illustrator/Photoshop or other compatible software saved to a .eps, .png, or .pdf file.
- Digital design must be a transparency (when printed, T-shirt color comes through any background where no design exists, i.e. the negative space of the design).



Traffic Flow Improvements!

Construction crews have finished work on the intersection of Highway 83 and 105. A combination of widened roadways and restriping will allow for eastbound traffic to turn left onto Highway 83, turn right onto Highway 83, or proceed straight through the intersection to the Walker Road roundabout that provides access to the Monument Academy East Campus. Westbound traffic will choose between turning left at Highway 83 or turning right on Highway 83/proceeding straight on Highway 105. This should improve traffic flow some during student arrival and release times in the short-term. Please see the image below for suggestions to help with efficiency using the new traffic pattern.



We have been in communications with the Colorado Department of Transportation, and in the next several weeks a new controller will be installed that adds dedicated left turn signal functionality to the traffic lights at this intersection. This should provide an additional, significant improvement to traffic flow to and from our campus in coming weeks.

Finally, the new entrance to our campus for northbound traffic on Highway 83 is open. This is a right turn, entrance only traffic lane for traffic approaching our campus on Highway 83 from the south. Enjoy the improvements to our traffic flow!
