As a charter, school policy is set by a volunteer parent Board. Members of the Board work diligently to ensure the school is staying true to the mission and vision of Monument Academy. The Board has two employees, the COO and CFO, and together this team makes decisions for the current and future success of the school.

Who Can Apply?

- Parents or Guardians of a current Monument Academy student are eligible.
- Applicants must be at least 25 years of age.
- Applicants should have an enthusiasm for MA and conviction in its purpose.

Election Timeline

- Complete the application and submit it to the Board
- Meet with 1-2 Board members to ask questions about the position
- Confirm desire to be an official candidate
- Attend as many Board meetings as possible

April:

January - March:

- Give a 5-minute statement of interest at Board Meeting
- Community Q&A session with candidates
- Formal 5-day election held last week of April

May:

 Election results announced to the community at Board Meeting June:

- Newly elected Directors sworn in at Board meeting, effective July 1st
- Complete Board training & background check

July:

July 1 begin a 3-year term as a voting member of the MA Board of Directors

Explore the world through books! Take the 2022 Library's 20 Book Reading Challenge! Sponsored by the MA library

This week, elementary students will receive a special bookmark and an official tracking sheet of the 20 different categories to use for this year's challenge!

Books should be appropriate for the reader's reading level, too. Not too easy and not too hard... reading together with your young child is allowed. Parents initial the log. Read only 1 book per category. Cannot be a book read previously. Please let your teacher know when your child has read 5, 10, 15 or 20 books! Prizes will be delivered to the classroom. Please direct questions to our Librarian, Mrs. Collier <u>kcollier@monumentacademy.net</u> Prizes given out along the way as readers meet a smaller goal:

- 5 books completed a bookmark or pencil and candy
- 10 books a treasure box prize and rice krispie treat
- 15 books by April 8th \$4 coupon to shop at the book fair (fair is April 8-18th)
- 20 books by April 4th celebration party on *May 3rd* with the super cool Principals

Keep reading... the many benefits of reading for pleasure

The American Library Association has also found a strong connection between daily independent reading habits and overall student performance. The ALA cites findings from several studies:

- Students who read independently become better readers, score higher on achievement tests in all subject areas, and have greater content knowledge than those who do not.
- The more elementary-aged students read outside of school, the higher they scored on reading achievement tests.
- Multiple studies support that even a small amount of independent reading increases primary and elementary students' reading comprehension, vocabulary growth, spelling facility, understanding of grammar, and knowledge of the world.

One key factor in the positive influence seems to be that it is voluntary — students seek out books and participate of their own volition.

Early exposure to reading appears to pay off in that it creates an expectation in children that reading is an essential part of their daily lives, thus the families of pre-readers in preschool, kindergarten, and early elementary must be encouraged to expose them to reading through story time at the library or reading as daily habit in the home.

As students grow up, a level of independence should be encouraged as it supports their commitment to reading and that later elementary and middle-school students should be spurred to choose their own books.


