Lights, Camera Auction! was a huge success! Over 300 people attended our exciting event on April 7th at the Boot Barn, enjoying drinks, food, friends, photos and a silent and live auction. It was a fabulous night to reconnect with our school community while raising funds for our beloved Monument Academy.

To those unable to attend our event, we were graced by the company of John and Maria Castillo, who tragically lost their son Kendrick in the Highlands Ranch STEM school shooting in 2019. Mr. Castillo shared their story of triumph over tragedy as the legacy of their son Kendrick now helps raise awareness of the importance of supporting school safety. I don't think there was a dry eye in the audience.

Amazingly, we raised over \$136,000 in this single evening, due to the incredible generosity of you and many others. \$90,000 of the money will be paid to our 72 teachers as a bonus of \$1,250. The remaining \$46,000 will go directly to school safety. What an incredible accomplishment.

MOBILITY: THE MANY BENEFITS! Why a pigeon? Well, for those in the know, you'll get it when it comes to stretching and "Pigeon".

Asking a kid to stretch is sometimes a tough sell. It's uncomfortable or it's simply of no interest. But over time most students begin to realize the benefits, which are many.

First, we stress that stretching should never hurt. Rather, pushing a stretch to a point of minor discomfort should be the focus and that after a short period of time it should begin to feel good.

Next, we also realize everyone is built differently and grows at a different rate. This is critically important when it comes to challenging the body and stressing range of motion about a joint. We encourage everyone to "listen to their body" and to pull back on a stretch and/or not stress a range of motion if something doesn't feel right.

Young people, who don't regularly work on their flexibility many times find themselves lacking mobility in areas around the hips/pelvis/lumbar spine and shoulder girdle areas. These areas provide all foundational movement patterns for the body. We will continue to encourage our students to work on their mobility for lifelong benefits!

This week in PE all students are reviewing "Benefits of Flexibility" that gives them a brief overview of how quality movement patterns can contribute to a greater quality of life. Below are just a few of the many benefits of flexibility training:

- Minimize/eliminate inefficient movement patterns
- May increase resistance to muscle injury, this is still being studied but there is lots of evidence supporting this
- Better mobility reduces chance of injury
- Reduces common problems like low back pain
