IMPORTANT:

Hearing and Vision screenings for 7th graders is scheduled for <u>October 1st</u>. PLEASE make sure students wear their glasses or contacts that day.

If your child takes a scheduled medication or any rescue medication, please bring it to the health office as well as documentation with doctor and parent signatures. LACROSSE IS COMING TO MA!

Next Spring, boys lacrosse will take the field for the first time at Monument Academy. In our continuing effort to provide additional extracurricular activities for all students, lacrosse will provide an opportunity for boys at the middle school level to compete with friends and continue to build a strong base of school pride and competition.

The program will be open to boys 6th - 8th grade and beginning in early October optional practices will begin. The new program will be coached by Ben Holstein, father to a current 6th grader and Drew Stevenson, MA East Physical Education Instructor/Assistant AD (and father to future MA student). Both coaches played youth through collegiate lacrosse and have been coaching for many years.

The lacrosse program will first operate as a "club" program, as it is in a probationary period before Monument Academy considers officially adopting the program as a sanctioned sport. As a club program, fees will be covered by family participation fees and fundraising.
