 - a. Strategic goal #1
 - b. Physical Security
 - Discussed, but information will not be made public due to security concerns.
 - c. Health and Wellness -
 - MA employs both a social worker and counselor.
 - ii. SOS program (Sources of Strength),
 - 1. Peer led and trained support.
 - 2. Kids are trained to point other kids in the right direction to get help.
 - 3. Group of trained peer students meet 2x per month.
 - 4. SoS wheels are placed on lockers to identify peers who can help.
 - 5. Posters have been put up.
 - 6. Training began at the end of last year and roll-out has been going

(successfully) since the beginning of this year.

- iii. Safe to tell app on student ipads
 - Safe to tell is an anonymous process to reach out for help.
- iv. Choice clubs during 8th period
 - Helps to build interest-based connections between students
- v. 8 keys of excellence
 - 1. character focused program
