

Dress Code for Non-Uniform Days, Events and Activities

During the school year, there are days when the uniform requirement is waived. Those times include, but are not limited to, free dress days, school sponsored sports events, fine arts events, school social activities, etc. Clothing in violation of the following requirements will require a phone call home and new clothing brought to campus. Our non-uniform days adhere to the same uniform mission statement: Monument Academy believes that a safe and disciplined learning environment is an important aspect of a rigorous school. Our uniform policy is intended to promote respect for the learning process, build school identity and community spirit, and to create a safe and orderly school climate.

- Students are not allowed to wear clothing that contains wording or images that could be interpreted as racial, vulgar or offensive in any way.
- Tops must not be see-through, bare midriff, backless, strapless or spaghetti straps. Tank tops or sleeveless tops must be at least 2" wide at the shoulder. Cold-shoulder style shirts are permitted.

- Bottoms must fit appropriately in accordance with the style of the garment. No undergarments may be visible.
- Shorts and skirts may not be shorter than 4" above the knee (mid-thigh).
- All garments should be neat and clean with no rips, tears, or holes, even by design.
- Leggings may be worn with a top that is below-hip or longer.
- Athletic shorts and joggers are allowed. They must be in good condition and fit appropriately. (No pajama bottoms)
- Shoes may be freely chosen on free dress days if they meet the requirements consistent with school safety: no sandals, snow boots, flip flops, Crocs, open-toe, clogs, light-up shoes, wheelies, open-heel shoes, or slippers. Heel height may not exceed 2".
- Hats or caps are not to be worn in the building unless it is part of the special program for the day.

Dances and Parties, Continuation

Special occasions call for special dress. We want our students to enjoy a special time while at the same time dressing appropriately for the occasion. On these occasions, clothing worn by students shall be in good condition, and neat in appearance.

- Dresses may be sleeveless, 'cold-shoulder' style, or have spaghetti straps.
- No strapless or backless styles are permitted. A sweater may not be used to cover up a strapless dress.
- Dresses must be no shorter than 4" above the knee (mid-thigh).
- Dress shoes are permissible if the heel is less than 2".

Dress Code

The Monument Academy dress code has been established to advance the mission and vision of the school, which includes an emphasis on academic excellence, respect, responsibility, character, and exemplary citizenship.

To that end, Monument Academy envisions and desires an environment where students have the privilege of pursuing their education in a safe, orderly environment free from distractions, including those brought by dress, and where students may focus more on the content of their character and less by external measures.

Monument Academy High School maintains one dress code for both boys and girls. Gender distinctions, where appropriate, have been annotated.

The dress code is intended to establish standards which maintain decorum and modesty and treat all students equitably. If a student or parent has a question about the acceptability of a clothing item, please bring that to the principal for input and clarification before wearing it to school. Monument Academy is cognizant of the Colorado CROWN Act, and the school's expectations do not restrict ethnic or religious expression.

This dress code applies at school as well as for school-sponsored activities, including events at other locations.

<u>Please note: there will be presentation days and leadership opportunities for which students will be required to wear business casual or business attire.</u>

GUIDELINES and	Character. Messages/words/images on clothing must align with Monument Academy's character emphasis.
STANDARDS	Respect . Students are not allowed to wear clothing that contains wording or images that could be interpreted as racial, vulgar, discriminatory, gang-related, or offensive. No sexual innuendos or references to alcohol, drugs, firearms, or tobacco (including electronic cigarettes) are permitted.
	Citizenship. Political statements or images must model good citizenship and be appropriate for an academic environment.
	Safety. Apparel that causes a safety hazard or could endanger a student is prohibited.
	Positive Learning Environment. Students should avoid apparel with an excessively tight fit such as skin-tight clothing that emphasizes descriptive lines of the body. Undergarments may not be exposed, nor may they be worn as outer garments.
	Responsibility . The Monument Academy dress code is intended to encourage students to dress responsibly and with mature consideration for our community's emphasis on academics and learning. This code is not intended to be all-inclusive. Rather the code provides general guidelines with certain specific examples to clarify intent and further inform our families.
	The final decision for dress code compliance will rest with the principal or designee.
SHIRTS	Shirts must be modest and avoid exposing inappropriate amounts of skin. For example, tops must not be strapless, see-through, bare the midriff, or contain spaghetti straps.
	Tank tops or sleeveless tops must be at least 2" wide at the shoulder with full sides. Cold-shoulder styles are permitted. Undershirts may not be worn as outerwear.
PANTS	Pants must be modest, fit at the waistline (no low-rise or sagging at the crotch). Pant bottoms must not touch the ground or impede walking.
	Modest leggings and tights are allowed with a top that extends below the hip or longer.
	All garments should be in good repair, neat and clean with no rips, tears, or holes, even by design.
	Joggers are allowed. They must be in good condition and fit appropriately. Pajama bottoms are not allowed.
SHORTS	The bottom of shorts must be at a maximum of 4" above the top of the knee (approximately mid-thigh).
	Athletic shorts are allowed.
SKIRTS STOCKINGS	The bottom of the skirt must be at a maximum of 4" above the top of the knee (approximately mid-thigh).
(girls only)	No fishnet-style stockings or hosiery that exposes the skin may be worn. No above-the-knee stockings or socks are allowed.

JACKETS	Permissible outerwear includes sweaters, fleece pullovers, jean jackets, athletic jackets, and sweatshirts. Outerwear may not be excessively baggy/oversized.
	Other winter-style coats are not appropriate for an indoor, academic environment and students should place those in a locker upon entering the building.
TIES (boys only)	Ties, if worn, must be cinched to the collar, and not worn loosely or untied.
SHOES	 Shoes are always required and must be consistent with school safety: Closed toed (no sandals, Crocs, or flip flops) No snow boots, slippers, wheelies Heel height may not exceed 2"
JEWELRY	Students may have no more than 2 earrings in each ear and one small stud in the nose. Nose rings and gauge-like earrings are not in compliance with the dress code.
	No other visible piercings are allowed.
	Any object that is designed for a purpose other than jewelry may not be worn as jewelry (ex: chains or collars)
TATTOOS	No visible tattoos or intentionally created marks, body art, or writing on skin is permitted.
MAKE-UP/NAIL POLISH (girls only)	Natural and modest make-up is permitted. No unusual or distracting colors (e.g. extensive black eye make-up or black lipstick). Up to two nail colors may be worn (ex: accent nails). Extreme nail decorations are prohibited, such as jewelry or writing.
HAIR	Natural hair color only. Multi-colored hair is prohibited except for naturally colored highlights consistent across the hair. Students must avoid such things as coloring just the tips of hair or having large sections of hair a different color.
	Hair styles and accessories must not be radical and thus avoid distracting the learning environment. Prohibited hairstyles include, but are not limited to, mohawks, dreadlocks, unusual or partially shaved hair, and face or eye-concealing cuts.
	No designs/patterns, symbols, or shapes of any kind may be shaved on the head.
	Facial hair must be neat and trimmed. Radical styles are prohibited (ex: braids and/or pony-tailed beards are not allowed)
HEAD	Hats, bandanas, do rag caps, and sunglasses must be removed upon entering the building and are thus prohibited in classrooms.
COVERINGS/SUNGLASSES	Head coverings for religious purposes must be pre-approved by the principal or designee.
CROSS-DRESSING	Students must comply with the dress code appropriate to their gender.
COSTUMES	Costumes are permissible only at designated times during the school year, such as spirit weeks, and only as publicized by the principal or designee. For safety reasons and student identification, masks are prohibited, unless for approved health reasons. Body enhancing accoutrements are considered costuming and are prohibited.

Students not in compliance with the dress code will be offered an opportunity to correct their dress code violation during first period. If the student is unable or unwilling to adhere to the dress code, he or she will be sent to the front office to contact a parent.
