Carline Statement from the Board of Directors

Mrs. Belisle read the following statement on behalf of the entire Board:

To: Monument Academy Carline Drivers Re: Carline Conduct at West and East Campuses From: Monument Academy Board of Directors Date: November 8, 2022

Thank you to everyone who makes the carline drop-off and pick-up a success. Without your disciplined adherence to our carline procedures, we would not be able to successfully manage the over 1,100 student drop-offs and pick-ups in a safe and relatively quick manner. Each day getting roughly 600 students in and out of West Campus and another 500 students in and out of East is no small undertaking; and we thank you for all you do to make this process go as smoothly as possible.

However, it has come to our attention that a small number of drivers are committing traffic violations, not following the requested procedures, and losing their tempers at staff and other drivers.

Speeding, stopping in undesignated places, and ignoring procedures only act to slow down the operation, but moreover is UNSAFE for both staff and students. Furthermore, disrespectful behavior toward our hardworking staff and other drivers is unacceptable. Remember too, making a left turn onto HWY 105 out of West Campus is strictly prohibited at ALL times. Finally, once you enter the West Campus property (just past the vision center), the traffic flow is one-way only.

For the safety of our children, staff and consideration of others, we will have no other recourse than notating specific cars who violate our carline rules. Ticketing and revoking carline access to our campuses is not the desired enforcement; but can and will be utilized if unwanted conduct continues. Remember, being late is not a viable excuse for risking injury to a child or staff member.

We must work together and realize that carline takes time. Please budget that into your daily routine. We know it's not ideal, but we need your patience and cooperation for the safety of our staff and our students. We also want to model our best behavior in front of our kids.
