CMAS Information for Grades 3-5

Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

If your child is in 3rd - 5th grade, we are approaching that time of year when we administer the CMAS test (CO State Standardized Assessment).

Assessments will begin on March 20th and conclude on April 28th.

- 5th Grade testing dates are 4/17 4/25 (Science, ELA, and Math)*
- 4th Grade testing dates are 3/23 4/4 (ELA and Math)*
- 3rd Grade testing dates are 3/20 3/22 (ELA and Math)*

Throughout the school year, Monument Academy will administer a variety of content related tests per state and federal requirements. The assessment calendar details each of the assessments (grades tested, purpose of test, dates of tests, format of tests)

Per Colorado law (HB 15-1323), parents have the right to refuse to have their child(ren) take state standardized tests marked with an asterisk (*). Also, per the same law, Lewis-Palmer School District adopted a policy for both paper/pencil and parent opt-out, available on the school district website. 

- Formal 5-day election held last week of April

May:

Election results announced to the community at the Board Meeting

June:

- Newly elected Directors sworn in at Board meeting, effective July 1st
- Complete Board training & background check

July:

• July 1 begins a 3-year term as a voting member of the MA Board of Directors


