MS CMAS Testing – 6th, 7th, and 8th grades

If your child is in 6th - 8th grade, we are approaching that time of year when we administer the CMAS test (CO State Standardized Assessment). The CMAS testing window is from March 20, 2023, to April 29, 2022.

- 6th Grade testing (ELA and Math)
- 7th Grade testing (ELA and Math)
- 8th Grade testing (ELA, Math, and Science)

The specific schedule for CMAS testing will be published mid-March.

Throughout the school year, Monument Academy administers a variety of content related tests per state and federal requirements. This <u>assessment calendar</u> on the Monument Academy website provides details on each of the assessments (i.e., grades tested, purpose of test, dates of tests).

Per Colorado law (HB 15-1323), parents have the right to refuse to have their child(ren) take the state standardized tests listed above. Parent Refusal Information is located on the MA website. The refusal form is located in FamilyID. If you are opting out of the state assessments, please complete this form by March 17, 2023, so an accurate schedule can be created. All students, whether completing the assessments or not, will attend school at MA East on testing days.

8th Grade YMCA Trip





Capturing Kids' Hearts | Family Newsletter #8



Develop strength to face something difficult.



This month we are focused on helping students understand that courage is not a magical remedy for fear. Instead, courage is a choice to push through fear, self-doubt, and anxiety to do things that feel hard or frightening. We are partnering with you this month to grow your child's courage. This month's activities will help your child understand that courage can equip them to make a positive impact at home, at school, and in the community.



1 Engage: Courage Role Play

Discuss having the courage to do the right thing. As a family, role-play situations with your child where they might have to demonstrate courage. For example, role-play what it would look like if they saw a friend being rude to someone else at school. What would they do? How can courage help them stand up for what is right?



2 Empower: Roles at Home

Create a list of household chores. Assign the various chores to each family member. Discuss any additional tools or support needed to accomplish each job. Have a weekly family check-in to celebrate success in completing each job by taking turns giving each family member an affirmation. Rotate chores and ask what additional support is needed.



3 Excel: Try Something New

Ask each family member to share something positive they want to do but have been afraid to try. Discuss what fears are getting in the way and steps to overcome those fears. Encourage everyone to try something new this month. Don't forget to celebrate each family member when they do!

Conversation Starters

- Describe a time when you were fearful at school, but you were able to overcome it because of your courage. What helped you to be courageous?
- Who is someone you consider to be courageous? What are some ways they show courage?
- Think of a recent failure at school. What was a lesson you learned from this experience?

As a charter, school policy is set by a volunteer parent Board. Members of the Board work diligently to ensure the school is staying true to the mission and vision of Monument Academy. The Board has two employees, the COO and CFO, and together this team makes decisions for the current and future success of the school.

Who Can Apply?

- Parents or Guardians of a current Monument Academy student are eligible
- Applicants must be at least 25 years of age
- Applicants should have an enthusiasm for MA and conviction in its purpose

Now - March 31st:

Election Timeline

- Complete the application and submit it to the Board
- Meet with 1-2 Board members to ask questions about the position
- Confirm desire to be an official candidate
- Attend as many Board meetings as possible

April:

- Give a 5-minute statement of interest at Board Meeting
- Community Q&A session with candidates
- Formal 5-day election held last week of April

May:

Election results announced to the community at the Board Meeting

June:

- Newly elected Directors sworn in at Board meeting, effective July 1st
- Complete Board training & background check

July:

• July 1 begins a 3-year term as a voting member of the MA Board of Directors
